A joint project followed with The New Zealand School for the Blind to help people better understand the painstaking process of adjusting to blindness.

Concurrently, cooperation with National Public Radio in the U.S. to produce documentary programs were begun showing the unique stance of New Zealand against nuclear weapons and the United States policy of sending its warships to ANZAC ports without declaring if they had nuclear weapons aboard. (ANZAC is based on a defense cooperation agreement between Australia, New Zealand and America).

The Foundation began research in the late 80's for a

film production about Tibetan refugees and their 40 years of exile in Pokaran, Nepal.

During the early 90's, the Foundation developed a reforestation and preservation project on a 9-acre site in Ubon, Thailand. The Foundation has also built a Training Center on the same site.

This is the 9th year in which The Foundation has been training Thai high school students who are interested in studying in America as exchange students and, through our American partners (The Center for Cultural Interchange - CCI, The Aspect Foundation, and American Year in the USA - AYUSA), helped place them with volunteer host families and American public schools for an Academic Year



The Learning Foundation exchange program in Thailand **LFS**, is under the Nong Kayang Foundation for Rural Development located in Uthai Thani, Thailand. The **LFS** program through the extensive networks of our American Exchange program partners not only benefits Thai students, who gain from their experience in America, but also benefits host families and American high school students and teachers as they learn firsthand about another culture.
